Cub O Ree Information and Rules

1. Registration will begin at 8:00am on Saturday at the **Putt Putt Course Parking Lot**. Units that have pre-registered may pick up schedules at the registration table. Den assignments will be assigned first come first register. If the Pack wants to be in the same Den please register [online](#) or together on Saturday.
2. Please park in the lower parking lot close to the playground. We need to keep the Putt Putt lot open for handicap and park visitors.
3. Dens will begin events promptly at 8:45am after the opening ceremony.
4. Packs/dens will be responsible for providing all medical forms, tents, equipment, food, and drink if Pack is camping either Friday, Saturday or both nights.
5. Since the Central NC Council group policy covers all registered scouts and scouters, no additional insurance fees or proof of insurance is necessary. However, during registration, all non-registered campers will be asked to sign a liability wavier.
6. The Cub Scout Promise, Cub Scout Law of the Pack, Boy Scout Oath, and Boy Scout Law will be followed at all times. Violation of the rules or conduct unbecoming of a Cub/Webelos Scout may lead to expulsion from the camp.
7. The BSA 2-deep adult leadership policy will be strictly enforced at all times. All scouts must be supervised during all events including all Pack activities at the Pack's campsite.
8. Alcoholic beverages are not allowed on Dan Nicholas Park (DNP) property or at BSA events. Possession of them will result in dismissal from Cuboree.
9. Illegal drugs found at the encampment, or suspicion of possession of illegal drugs will not only result in dismissal from the property, but will force the staff to notify law enforcement officials immediately.
10. In accordance with BSA policy, liquid fuels may be used for cooking and lighting only if the fuels are used under adult supervision.
11. ***If a burning ban is not in effect***, campfires are permitted in campsite. Dug fire pits are allowed if no trace remains upon checkout. It is recommended that fires be built in a container such as a charcoal grill to insure the campsite can be cleaned properly. Fires must be attended at all times. Fires must be cold before checking out Sunday morning.
12. Campsite should follow low-impact camping guidelines and should meet the campsite checklist guidelines (see enclosure) as closely as possible.
13. Sheath knives or knives with fixed blades are not permitted.
14. Defacing of any DNP property, including live trees, may result in immediate dismissal from the camp with repair cost settled before dismissal.

15. Radios, TVs, electronic games, or other electric devices are not permitted.
16. Fireworks of any type are strictly prohibited.
17. No bicycles will be permitted.
18. Quiet times should be observed with everyone in their campsites.

Gear Suggestions

PACK – Medical Forms (A, B sections) for every Individual, Water cooler, ice, tents, rope(s), fire building supplies, lantern(s) w/fuel, first aid kit, **food** for lunch/supper on Saturday/breakfast on Sunday/snacks, cooking supplies, dishes/utensils, water buckets.

INDIVIDUAL SCOUTS – Tent, tarp, sleeping Bag, pillow, t-shirt(s), short pants, extra underwear, pajamas, jacket, rain poncho, hat or cap, socks, extra pair of shoes, toothbrush/toothpaste, towel, wash cloth, water bottle/canteen, personal first aid kit, sunscreen, insect repellent, flashlight with extra batteries, folding camp chair, water bottle.

No CROCS, FLIP FLOPS, KEENS, OR OPEN TOE SHOES IN CAMP. Sneakers or boots should be worn at all times.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Will there be many insects? Can anything be done to control them?

Make sure adults and scouts bring insect repellent or netting to help decrease bug bites. Make sure tents are closed to keep bugs out.

2. Can a scout stay in the same tent with his parent?

Yes. Boys are encouraged to tent with other boys but some scouts will be more comfortable being in the same tent with their parent. Guide to Safe Scouting only allows a boy tenting with his own parent.

3. Are campsites assigned?

No. As mentioned earlier, campsites are a first come, first serve basis.

4. Are medical forms(A,B sections) for every(child & adult) individual necessary?

Yes. New Health and Safety standards in the council procedures require medical forms be available for all campers in any camping situation. With this event, the pack will maintain control of medicals and medicines.

5. Does the pack have to leave immediately after the closing on Sunday morning?

No, the pack may choose to stay longer to work on advancements, fish, or enjoy the beautiful park. The decision to stay is the responsibility of pack leadership.

6. How are scouts assigned to Dens? If Packs register online, they will be assigned to the same Den. A Pack representative will need to pick up Den schedule at registration table. If scout registers on Saturday, he will be assigned to Den based on first come first served. Dens will consist of 10 scouts.

Cub O Ree Events



Archery – Dens will receive instructions on archery safety and proper handling. They will then be allowed to practice using Bows and arrows.

Games – Scouts will play an organized game.

BB Guns – Dens will receive instructions on gun safety and proper handling. They will then be allowed to practice using BB guns.

Orienteering – Dens will learn how to use and a Compass. They will use to compass to navigate through a marked course.



Fire Building and Leave No Trace Principles - Each patrol (den) will be given instruction on Leave No Trace principles and fire building. The patrol will then be allowed to collect materials and build a small fire.

Craft- Scouts will learn craft safety and will make a craft out of wood, fabric or other material.

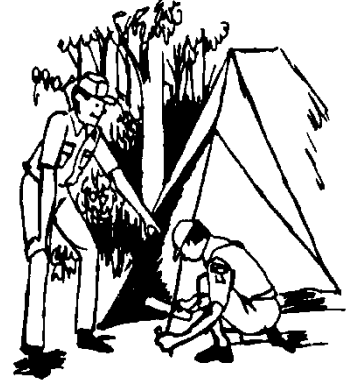


CAMPSITE CHECKLIST

1. PACK AND DEN CAMPSITE LAYOUT

Showing consideration of wind, terrain, safety, site assignment, and other relevant factors:

- a. Tents arranged by den
- b. Location of food storage, preparation, and cooking areas
- c. Location and storage of fuels
- d. Location of chopping area
- e. Pack/den identification - Flags, gateways, etc.
- f. Posted in campsite
 - 1) Menu for all den meals
 - 2) Duty roster for each den member
 - 3) Schedule of events/den itinerary



2. DEN COOKING AND CLEANUP

- a. Food storage(ice chests, food chests, patrol boxes)
- b. Potable(drinking) water storage
- c. Storage of pots, pans and utensils
- d. Cleanliness of den cooking, eating, cleanup equipment
- e. Den site clean and free of food scraps and trash
- f. Trash bags for disposal of trash and garbage

3. DEN FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT

- a. 2 fire buckets with water in cooking area
- b. 1 fire bucket with water at each tent

4. PACK AND DEN FIRST AID METHODS

- a. First aid kit in plain view and accessible
- b. Appropriate sized first aid kit
- c. First aid kit properly stocked with correct items

5. DEN CHOPPING AREA (if needed)

- a. Roped off
- b. Free of brush, trash and overhanging limbs
- c. Chopping block properly stationed and securely staked
- d. Tools properly displayed or stored
- e. Wood pile neat with some wood in waterproof storage

6. PACK AND DEN CONSERVATION

- a. No hacked or cuts on live trees
- b. No pathways or leaves brushed away from camping areas
- c. No trenching of tents or other areas
